The primary focus of the residency is to become a competent infectious diseases clinician. This is accomplished by rounding with adult and pediatric infectious diseases consult services and supporting an antimicrobial stewardship service that serves four affiliated hospitals

Activities while on rotations will include (but are not limited to):

- Rounding with the patient care team and responsibility for antimicrobial stewardship patient care review
- Patient monitoring/problem solving
- Investigation of medication error reports and adverse drug reactions
- Drug information and literature searches
- Pharmacy practice research (translational research focused combining experiences at the school of pharmacy with patient care)
- Team-related projects
- Communication and interaction with pharmacists, physicians, and nurses
- Contributing as a member of the Infectious Diseases and Antimicrobial Stewardship team

- Major research project suitable for publication
 - Major project will be presented at the Great Lakes Pharmacy Resident Conference. Residents may also present at the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin Educational Conference.
 - It may also be presented at the Infectious Diseases Society of America Annual Meeting or the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists or other clinical meeting
