The primary focus of the residency is to become a competent critical care clinician in areas of medical and surgical critical care pharmacotherapy

Activities while on the unit will include (but are not limited to):

- Rounding with the critical care team daily
- Patient monitoring/problem solving
- Investigation of medication error reports and adverse drug reactions
- Drug information and literature searches
- Attending codes
- Team-related projects
- Communication and interaction with pharmacists, physicians, nurses, respiratory therapists, and dietitians
- Contributing as a member of the critical care team

PROJECTS:

- Major research project suitable for publication
 - Major project will be presented at the Great Lakes Pharmacy Resident Conference. Residents may also present at the Pharmacy Society of Wisconsin Educational Conference.
 - It may also be presented at the Society of Critical Care Medicine Annual Meeting or the American Society of Health-System Pharmacists or other clinical meeting.
- Past resident projects include:
 - Assessed propylene glycol toxicity from lorazepam infusions
 - o Developed enteral feeding/drug interaction table
 - o Surveyed Critical Care pharmacy practice across the US
 - o Evaluated the use of an antibiotic order form in the ICU
 - o Evaluated the use of a CRRT table for dosing of antibiotics and non-antibiotics

STRENGTHS:

- Depth and breadth of clinical pharmacy services at UW (and long history of such)
- World class center of medical excellence
- 24 bed medical/surgical intensive care unit (Level 1 Trauma Center)
- Excellent relationships with physicians and nurses
- Experienced critical care pharmacists with subspecialties in ID, cardiology, and renal dosing
- Integral part of multidisciplinary team
- Flexibility in tailoring program to needs/interests
- "Staffing" in intensive care unit rather than production

- Extensive involvement with School of Pharmacy in didactic teaching and preceptorship of students

- Assessed the time to positive cultures and antibiotic changes
- O Assessed the percentage of patients who were started on stress ulcer prophylaxis and then were inappropriately prescribed them on discharge
- Evaluated differences between pharmacist-obtained and physician-obtained medication histories in the intensive care unit
- Evaluated the use of prolonged infusions of piperacillin/tazobactam and meropenem in the intensive care unit
- O Quetiapine use in a mixed medical/surgical intensive care unit
- Efficacy of a novel antibiotic dose reduction strategy based on pharmacokinetic and pharmacodynamic principles in the intensive care unit
- o Evaluated the efficacy of a new dosage regimen for daptomycin
- Monte Carlo simulation of antibiotics on CRRT
